The American Society of Health-System Pharmacists (ASHP) Foundation has developed research grant programs and resources for pharmacy residents, clinicians and faculty who are interested in practice-based research but have limited research experience. Research Boot Camp - Apply by November 1, 2011

Looking to build your research skills? The Research Boot Camp is a research skills development program composed of distance education, on-site training, and research conduct components. The program fosters the development of pharmacists with practice-based research skills and provides an opportunity for up to nine new pharmacist researchers to participate in a comprehensive distance education and experiential program. Participants will develop a research idea into a well-structured research plan to be executed following program completion. ***The deadline to apply is November 1, 2011.*** For more information, visit www.ashpfoundation.org/bootcamp.

Pharmacy Resident Practice-Based Research Grant - Apply by October 21, 2011

The Pharmacy Resident Practice-Based Research Grant Program supports practice-based research, related to the ASHP/ASHP Foundation Pharmacy Practice Model Initiative (PPMI), conducted by residents in ASHP-accredited pharmacy residency programs and residents in pharmacy residency programs that have submitted an application for ASHP accreditation. Up to six \$5,000 grants will be awarded. ***The deadline to submit applications is October 21, 2011.*** More information is available at www.ashpfoundation.org/residentgrant.

New Investigator Research Grant – Apply by January 17, 2012

The ASHP Foundation's New Investigator Research Grant Program (formerly the Junior Investigator Research Grant Program) supports practice-based research related to the ASHP/ASHP Foundation Pharmacy Practice Model Initiative (PPMI) and conducted by pharmacist new investigators.

The overarching goal of the PPMI is to increase pharmacist participation on patient care teams as the professional who is responsible and accountable for patients' medication-related outcomes while delegating all medication distribution functions that do not require clinical judgment to qualified pharmacy technicians and technology.

Submission of studies that evaluate the pharmacy practice models in hospitals and health systems – such as the utilization of technology, role delineation changes for the pharmacists and non-pharmacists, or improving the patient care opportunities for pharmacists – is invited. Applicants can find the beliefs, assumptions and recommendations from the PPMI Summit in the PPMI Web Resource Center (<http://www.ashp.org/PPMI/PPMISummit/Materials.aspx>). This resource center also includes the full proceedings of the PPMI Summit along with audio-synchronized slide presentations.
