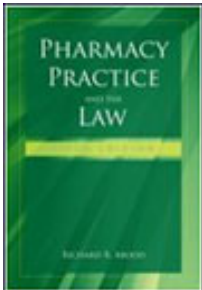

Online reviews and exams available for purchase are helpful in terms of question-format and preparing to take the online exam, but the content on the law exam varies and is individualized, so do not rely on content with online practice exams. You would be better off reviewing the state and federal laws, and practice questions in one of the books listed above.

NAPLEX Tips:

1. Find one central source with as much detailed information and stick with it. Do not overload with books. I suggest the APhA Complete Review for Pharmacy by Drs. Gourley and Eoff for the NAPLEX review. I felt it had the most complete information in the most concise format.
2. Review the chapters and take the practice questions prior to review. Those chapters that you score lowest on will require more time to study than those you are familiar with.
3. Study major disease states first, then minor disease states.
4. Do not hang your fate on online practice tests. While these are helpful, they are subjective to the creators of the questions and are not an accurate predictor of your fate.
5. Relax! This is a review of the pharmacy practice you learned in school.
6. Search online book stores, such as Amazon.com for used copies of the review books.

MPJE Tips:

1. I would suggest purchasing more than one source for your law review.
2. Reiss and Hall's Guide to Federal Pharmacy Law has excellent practice questions and practical applications of federal pharmacy laws, and I recommend this review book as practical application.
3. The TPA Law book is a good resource for comprehensive law, and the searchable digital CD version makes for easy law reference. This law book is expensive but allows for easier access and review than the Board of Pharmacy book, and also stays up-to-date with periodic updates to pharmacy law.
4. The Board of Pharmacy law book is a great reference to have, and is affordable at \$10.00 a copy. It does not include most federal laws, but is a good Tennessee reference.
5. Do not hang your fate on online practice tests. While these are helpful, they are subjective to the creators of the questions and are not an accurate predictor of your fate.
