

# The Community Pharmacy Transformation Project and Implementation of Technician Product Verification

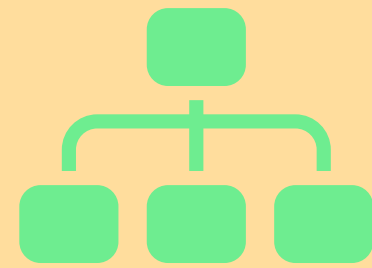

Would permit a certified pharmacy technician with advanced training in product verification to deliver the final verification of medication products (excluding compounds and controlled substances)



Would not change the pharmacist supervision requirements for pharmacy technicians



Would empower certified pharmacy technicians to screen patients and refer eligible patients to pharmacists for additional care and services



Would not remove the pharmacist from the clinical decision-making process, Drug Utilization Review (DUR), or any other clinical component of the prescription dispensing process



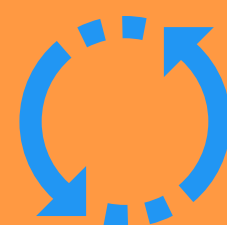
Would utilize a new pharmacy practice model to free up more time to increase patient access to pharmacist-provided services



Would not diminish the importance of the pharmacist or pharmacy license



Would increase pharmacist-provided services such as those authorized by prescribers under Collaborative Pharmacy Practice Agreements (CPPAs)



Would not replace pharmacists with pharmacy technicians (If a pharmacist's hours are cut, the Board of Pharmacy will revoke the pharmacy's permission to participate.)
